**Greenville County Library System Given Award to
Promote Electronic Health Resources to the Public**

Greenville, SC – The Greenville County Library System was recently selected by the National Network of Libraries of Medicine (NN/LM), Southeastern/Atlantic (SE/A) Region to receive an Express Outreach Project Award, to promote the use of technology in gaining access to health information. With this award, the library will begin the **Senior Health Information Project (SHIP)**, which will focus on introducing senior citizens of Greenville County to reliable sources of health information that are available electronically.

Between July and November 2010, library representatives will visit approximately 20 community centers throughout Greenville County, informing senior citizens about the vast array of useful health information that is available through the Greenville County Library System's website. The sessions will include a demonstration of the resources followed by hands-on practice.
