The Greenville County Library System is pleased to announce its contribution to the South Carolina Digital Library.

Greenville, SC – The Carolina First South Carolina Room at the Hughes Main Library has completed over a year of efforts in a statewide collaborative effort that includes schools, libraries, museums and archives. Contributing participants were encouraged to create and promote digital collections representing South Carolina’s historical and cultural resources.

The South Carolina Room successfully digitized and contributed a selection of photographs and postcards, as well as imaging two handwritten volumes: a handmade store ledger circa 1794, and a Spanish War Veterans ledger, all from the library’s permanent collection.

The resulting collection, named the **South Carolina Digital Library**, is available online from the SC Room page of our website, www.greenvillelibrary.org.
