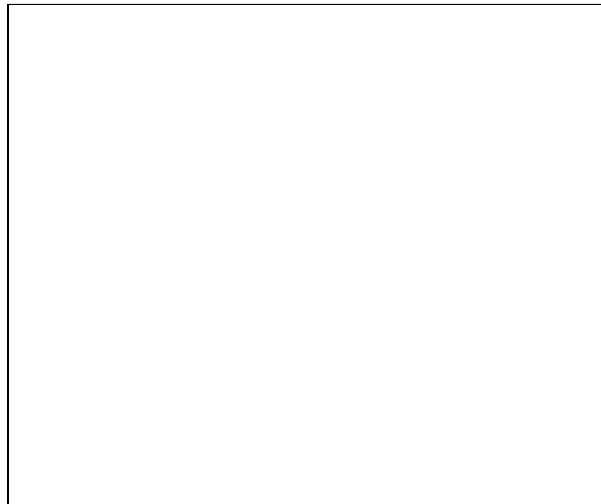
Looking ahead: August
