

Researching Your Home's History South Carolina Room

- Trace ownership using deeds
 - Use Real Property Search to find old property cards (<u>https://www.greenvillecounty.org/appsas400/RealProperty</u>)
 - Deeds/plats searchable online; also available on microfilm (<u>https://www.greenvillecounty.org/rod/searchrecords.aspx</u>)
- City directories to see who lived in the home (SC 917.5727; Ancestry.com Library Edition and Heritage Quest have city directory collections)
- Maps
 - Sanborn Fire Insurance Maps for homes in city (keep in mind city limits change over time)
 - USC digitized maps

 - Sanborn Fire Insurance Maps also available on microfilm
